

NEW LEC LITERACY SITES LAUNCHED

The LEC launched its first literacy tutoring program at Greer Elementary School in Charlottesville, Virginia, in 2021 and will launch new programs at Randolph Elementary School in Arlington, Virginia, and at James River Elementary School in Williamsburg, Virginia, this fall.

The LEC is partnering with the UVA Police Department to serve students at Mary Greer; the Arlington Police Department and members from Incarnation Anglican Church will assist with the new literacy initiative at Randolph Elementary School.

TUTORING & LEARNING LOSS

As we learn to embrace a new normal, we find ourselves attempting to assess the aftermath of the pandemic on everyday life. Certainly, things are not the same as we recover from the altered routines and rhythms caused by a pandemic that does not want to let go. This year, learning loss is a significant challenge for the LEC and the schools across America. According to researchers, "school leaders are now racing to build programs that, they hope, will help students make up for at least some of this missed learning. One popular approach is 'high-dosage' tutoring."


During the 2022-23 academic year, the LEC will launch 27 literacy sites in Title I schools throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia. For the first time since 2019, most of our programs will be in-person. We hope to serve at least 300 students from the Hampton Roads, Williamsburg, Richmond, Northern Virginia and Charlottesville areas. The need for one-to-one tutoring is greater today than it has ever been. The LEC will partner with school districts from around the commonwealth to help students recover the fundamentals of reading that were lost from the lack of face-to-face instruction.
